Law and order

CCTV proposed for Kropp Park

I've called for Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) of Kropp Park due to a spate of recent vandalism. I'm hoping the City will be able to install CCTV in this popular park. This action is being supported by Coolangatta Police.

Illegal activity

The City has received several reports of public drinking along the Tugun to Bilinga Oceanway. Police have asked that if anyone observes this illegal behaviour to immediately report it to the police.

Local area works

Boundary Street, Currumbin Waters stormwater drainage improvements

Stage 3 of this project commenced in October and is expected to be completed by May 2021. Engagement with internal and external stakeholders is ongoing including face-to-face consultations with property owners and residents, mail-outs and letter-box drops to directly impacted residents, local project signage and updated webpage project details.

Stage 3 works include installation of a new underground drainage network along Elizabeth Street and Noojee

Street, crossing Michel Drive, with a new outfall constructed into Currumbin Creek and the relocation of underground services. This will also involve the resealing of road surfaces, kerbs and affected driveways.

Update on major upgrades to Kirra **Pavilion**

Cyclists, please ensure you dismount and be mindful of pedestrian safety on the temporary walk-way that has been installed to accommodate major upgrades at the Kirra Pavillion.

Mateship Run 2020



MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Getting on with the job

Even in a pandemic, our fabulous Gold Coast spirit makes us want to get on with life with as little disruption as possible and that is certainly the City's approach to making things happen.

Congestion-busting is one of my core priorities so I'm happy to report two major bridge improvements. We are removing the Isle of Capri bottleneck by constructing a new two-lane bridge downstream of the current narrow roadway.

The \$40 million project is now full steam ahead to increase daily vehicle capacity by nearly 50%. A wider vehicle and pedestrian bridge will be constructed with the old bridge to then be removed and replaced by a twin of the first. This will keep traffic flowing and the project is generating 137 new jobs.

Meantime down south, the new Tallebudgera Coplicks footbridge is now open, replacing the 84 year old former structure to make the crossing safer and flood resilient. School-children, older folk and cyclists will particularly love this new amenity that will serve the community for another 100 years.

Parts of the old bridge that was built in 1936 have been saved for heritage purposes and used in the new one. Design and other earthworks improvements will reduce upstream flooding to protect the local community. It's a great improvement for one of the city's most beautiful places.

Speaking of which, did you realise that Kirra Hill has just celebrated its centenary. Site of the Coolangatta State School, this iconic Gold Coast facility was built when the 1919 Spanish Flu epidemic prompted closure of the NSW border, cutting off children who attended the Tweed Heads Public School. They say history repeats and to me this is a classic example.

We are fortunate to have such a wonderful asset with its stunning scenic views across our city combined with a community centre that brings people together to enjoy a great range of events, arts and culture programs, fitness classes and social gatherings.

But wherever we are in our city, we must be mindful that nature is a powerful force and we need to remain alert and prepared for storm, flood and bushfire events.

Weather forecasters are predicting a La Nina cycle this year so summer may provide some real challenges. I encourage everyone to assemble an emergency kit, make sure your home is secure and clear of debris or rubbish and have a plan worked out if things get grim.

Our disaster management centre and its staff are well prepared for the coming storm season but I encourage everyone to play their part. Please stay safe and well until I talk to you again.
